Client Report 2024

Last year, 15,972 calls were made to CAP UK concerning debt help and 8,306 households were supported on their journey out of debt. A total of 2,292 clients went debt free and 3,638 people received expert money coaching through locally run courses. health, Mental ill low income relationship breakdown continue to be the main factors contributing to unmanageable debt, whilst the increased cost of living has resulted in 47% of the budgets produced being unsustainable - even after reducing non-essential spending.

Unmanageable debt comes with an overwhelming amount of pressure, leading people to live in a state of fear and worry.
